

Not Enough aid for families

Despite the unprecedented global relief effort for the tsunami, just 60% of those affected in India and Sri Lanka said they got timely and adequate aid in the first 60 days, according to a survey released this week.

The survey of affected families and aid workers in the two countries showed the relief effort succeeded in delivering aid to millions of people, according to the non-profit Fritz Institute.

In India and Sri Lanka, about 60% of the non-governmental aid groups surveyed said they did not have enough warehouse facilities and 40% lacked adequate transportation. – Reuters
